Chairman's Comment

On behalf of the Parish Council I would like to wish everybody reading this newsletter a happy 2013.

Last year, 2012 was truly memorable for the country, celebrating The Queen's Jubilee and hosting the Olympics and what was probably the greatest show on earth to date.

It was also a pretty memorable year for the Parish with a royal visit by the Duchess of Cornwall to unveil Colnbrook's Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Clock.





It can be remembered for the great response from local businesses, sponsors, the schools and members of the community. However it will probably be remembered best for the malfunction of the unveiling cord which eventually snapped under the strain of the Duchess, one of her bodyguards and me all pulling in an effort to reveal the lovely new clock.



Fortunately a pole was on hand and with a couple of fellow councillors and the Church warden the veil was eventually removed.

In the end what seemed at first to be a disaster turned into a triumph. The Duchess thoroughly enjoyed the roars from the children every time a face of the clock was revealed and then the groans when the veil dropped back down until in the end the black cloth was fully removed and all faces of the clock were on show to great cheers and applause.



The Parish Council also hosted a well attended Jubilee Dinner at La Bettola Restaurant.

On the more official side, our objections to the Slough International Freight Exchange were successful and the planning application was thrown out. Although an appeal was made the recent Radlett decision does look very promising for Colnbrook and hopefully our green belt areas will remain protected.

The Parish Council now has representation on Colne Valley Park Community Interest Group and Councillor Leslie Jarrett has very recently taken the position of a Director. This will give us a greater voice in the ongoing protection of greenbelt and the enhancement of our portion of the Colne Valley Park.

The council continues in its efforts to encourage community cohesion and we are pleased to see the Colnbrook Residents Association and the Colnbrook Community Partnership playing their part in this.

After representations made by the Parish Council we are pleased to see some increase in the numbers of Doctors Surgeries being held in the village.

The Police advise us that generally Colnbrook with Poyle has the lowest crime rates in Slough. Probably this can be attributed to the extra policing Colnbrook has through partial funding of PCSO's by the Parish Council. Normally areas close to the border of neighbouring Police Authorities suffer a higher rate of crime (Colnbrook is in the Thames Valley and borders The Metropolitan area).

Work with Slough Borough Council Highways department continues in efforts to combat the levels of traffic passing through the village.

The regular Parish Council prizes were awarded to pupils at both schools at the end of term.



This terms winners were: Hafsa Hussain, Mateusz Kielar, Joseph Burden and Tyrese Mckie from Colnbrook C of E Primary School with Uzma Iqbal, Nathan Hawes, Weronika Dobinska and Alfie Smith from Pippins School.

Lastly but very importantly you will see elsewhere that we have a drop in forum (Parish Chat) arranged for I 6th of February and we would welcome your attendance and comments/ questions on Policing, Traffic, Green belt and any other matters.

The EWG team started the year by completing the Management Plan that was required to be submitted with the Green Flag application for Colnbrook Recreation Ground.

Then it was onto completing the Planning application form for the Jubilee Clock and as this was to be erected in the conservation area stringent rules applied. Thankfully, this was eventually passed by the Slough Borough Council's planning dept.

The next pressing task was making arrangements for the installation of the electricity supply and concrete base for the clock. In between this the Clerk had written to the Palace to see if we could get a member of the Royal family to carry out the unveiling ceremony. As it transpired he was very successful and so the installation of the clock was timed for just before the Royal visit.

The now traditional hanging baskets were erected in early June with Red, White and Blue flowers to mark the Jubilee year and of course the Royal visit.

The Colnbrook museum area in The Ostrich was spruced up ready to show the Old Clock and Fire Tender to the Duchess of Cornwall as part of the history of Colnbrook. Needless to say and as everyone knows what followed was a very successful and enjoyable day for the whole village.

We heard in July 2012 that we had been successful in our application for the Green Flag for excellent Parks and it was then onto getting a pole erected to fly this very prestigious award. We were also delighted to learn that Pippins Park had retained the Green Flag that was awarded to it the year before. A joint ceremony for both awards where the Flags were raised was held in August.

It is through the extremely hard work of the Environment Working Group and Colnbrook Community Partnership that these flags are now flying over our recreation grounds.

Early autumn saw more activity with the planting of over 400 hundred spring bulbs in the Recreation Ground. The bulbs had been kindly donated by Grundons.

A new hedgerow was also planted by volunteers and Groundwork Thames Valley near the entrance to Crown Meadow.

To finish a busy year and as normal the Christmas trees and lighting were erected for the festive season.

The Environment Working Group is always on the lookout for ways to improve the area to help the local community Love where we Live and Work. So, if you have an idea please bring it to us. We will be represented at The Parish Chat on 16th February (see elsewhere in this newsletter for details).

The partnership is attended by representatives of SBC, Local Residents, Groundwork Thames Valley South and the Parish Council.

The beginning of the year saw the Partnership putting together the design for the refurbishment of Westfield Community Centre after successfully securing funding for the scheme. Tenders were then sought and work started in June 2012 and finished in July 2012 with a grand opening of the refurbished Centre. This is now an excellent facility for local residents to hire for a variety of uses.

July was a complete triumph as Green Flags were awarded to Pippins Park for the second year running and to Colnbrook Recreation ground with its first year award. Both these flags were the result of the extensive work by the Partnership in funding and designing the parks to a very high standard which enabled the applications for the Green Flag award for Excellent Parks.

After the spring time consultation for the St Thomas Church quiet garden the final budget was set and the Partnership were successful in once



again applying for funding for the refurbishment of St Thomas Church Quiet Garden. Work started in the autumn and phase 1 of the works was complete at the end of November 2012. The next phase will be in the spring time where we would love the local residents to come and help with the day, planting the last of the hedgerows etc. and as usual refreshments will be available. This will culminate in the grand opening ceremony where we are hoping to have many dignitaries present.

During 2012 work also commenced on Crown Meadow to bring it back into a Bio-diversity condition and status. The pruning of the trees will allow light to enter the banks of the stream and the stream itself. This will encourage wildlife to flourish. The area around the pond has also been pruned

back to create the same conditions. All the resulting cuttings have been carefully laid out nearby to create habitats for smaller creatures which in turn will provide food further up the chain.



Autumn was also the time when the Partnership decided that it would like to create a discovery trail around Colnbrook which will take in the parks, Crown Meadow and the footpaths around the Village. There will be approximately 7No information boards at strategic points along the trail interspersed with arrows to ensure that people can easily follow the trail. Funding for this project is being sought and we will keep you informed of the progress. The last meeting of the Partnership in 2012 resulted in agreement to provide Groundwork's Thames Valley South with a \pounds 5,000 grant to enable them to continue their great work on the Green Spaces around Colnbrook.

2012 also saw the inception of the **TALE OF TWO VILLAGES**. This a joint venture between Colnbrook with Poyle and Iver Village. The idea being to plot the history of the two villages and to involve the youngsters in collating the information gathered together with pictures and creating a historical and present day view of the life and times of the villages.

One unfortunate piece of news is that, whilst the Partnership continued funding the newly improved Westfield Community Centre for the Youth Service to provide activities for the youngsters Slough Borough Council no longer fund the scheme and so this service ceased in May 2012. However we are on the case and Slough tell us they are currently re-structuring Youth provision throughout the Borough.

Crime is down in Colnbrook

Message from your neighbourhood policing team

Insp Shelly Squire, from the neighbourhood policing team (NHPT), said: "We have worked closely with our partners and other Thames Valley Police departments to concentrate on the crime types that matter most to the community. "Over the past twelve months many operations and initiatives have taken place targeting dwelling burglary, shed thefts and focusing on known offenders. By investing this time the results can be seen and hopefully felt by residents."

In the period from December 2011 to November 2012, there were 708 crimes reported, compared to 814 in the same period in the previous 12 months. In the same year on year period, robbery has halved – from 8 to 4 offences, anti-social behaviour (ASB) is down from 230 to 157, vehicle crime is down from 164 to 117.

The NHPT has run several operations and initiatives during 2012 which have no doubt impacted on the crime figures reduction, including:

Operation Cape saw targeted patrols of burglary hotspots in the parish and engagement with known offenders. It was run by Local CID using neighbourhood staff.

Operation Crop was door to door enquires to conduct home security surveys to combat burglaries and shed breaks.

Operation Candle saw street surveys being carried out to record homes in darkness in the evenings. This was followed up with a letter and a free timer switch offered by NHPT to properties that were identified as possibly vulnerable.

Operation Closure was the local police response to any request from housing associations on our area to assist with either disclosure or eviction of repeat ASB offenders.

Moving forward, work is commencing to combat bilking and number plate theft. A day of action on the forecourt is planned, where tamper proof number plate screws are fitted to cars that stop for fuel. High visibility presence will deter fuel theft and changing screws will address number plate thefts.

Several intelligence gathering exercises have taken place with an engagement programme of every door in the parish being knocked. This have given NHPT the opportunity to introduce themselves, identify known offenders on the area, canvass opinion of effectiveness and address any issues that may have come from the engagement.

Inspector Shelly Squire adds this comment :

"Community involvement and assistance is a vital part of delivering targeted and effective policing. Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's) provide re-assurance to the public, they act as the eyes and ears to the wider policing family and gather invaluable intelligence. A great deal of police activity has been supported by the presence of the local dedicated officers and the PCSO's in the Colnbrook and Poyle area and they have been instrumental in addressing community priorities, targeting anti – social behaviour and working on crime prevention and reduction initiatives."
