Message from the Vice Chair

I was elected to the Parish Council in May this year and was also elected to Vice-Chair. During canvassing and in the initial weeks after the election I listened to residents and their concerns, specifically relating to the Heathrow expansion, the planned road widening on the A4, the proposed Park and Ride in Westfield and the closure of the Doctors' surgery with the resulting difficulties in getting into Langley due to limited public transport.

With members of the Parish Council I was able to plan two community meetings with officers from Slough Borough Council to speak about the expansion on the A4 and the Park and Ride proposal. I believe it is important that residents hear about plans directly to form their opinion based on credible information.

Also, with members of the Parish Council, I have been working on an electric bus trial which will help residents get to the Doctor's surgery on Common Road in Langley. This is planned to come into operation imminently and, while it is frustrating that at the time of writing a date has not been agreed, this is something that I will keep pushing for so that residents can see results rather than just hear promises.

I have also had two meetings with members of the Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) for the area, including the Director of Strategy and Operations, as well as with the cabinet member for Health & Wellbeing from Slough Borough Council, to discuss and explore options to bring some Health Services back into Colnbrook.

I have been encouraged by the CCG's openness and the innovative solutions that are being discussed. Again, like you, I am not satisfied with just words and I am optimistic that progress is possible and I will continue to work towards this throughout my term as your Parish Councillor.

Collectively; we are improving communication with our vastly improved website including a better mobile interface, working to improve our recreation ground and taking care of our green spaces. I feel privileged to be a part of what the Parish Council is working towards, together, for the residents of Colnbrook with Poyle.

Finally, I have been able to get involved in some of the social activities, including Colnfest, a great event organised by the Colnbrook Residents Association, where myself and a band of musician friends entertained residents for an hour or so and also by attending 'Are you Being Served', a thoroughly entertaining show by CAST at the Colnbrook Village Hall; I cannot recommend their performances highly enough!

I'm looking forward to all of the activities this festive season will bring and, however you choose to celebrate, I would like to wish you all a wonderful, happy and healthy Christmas and New Year!

The CCA continues to work with members, residents, the Parish Council, SBC, TVP and various agencies to improve our communities, instigate projects based on matters brought to our attention, and report to the responsible.

Milestone restoration

Colnbrook has two historic milestones, one on the High Street opposite the Ostrich Inn and the other on the triangular reservation of the roundabout exiting on the J5 of the M4.

Both are in a terrible state of disrepair and without specialist restoration attention will eventually rot away and be lost forever.



The CCA has highlighted this and actively been working to establish funding and assistance with a number of third parties to enable these historic artefacts to be restored to their former glory.

We are hopeful that with the combined efforts of Cllr Smith, the Parish Council, Heathrow "Better Neighbourhood" Group, the Colnbrook Community Partnership and Slough Borough Council the necessary funding can be met to carry out the work required.

Historic buildings

CCA members and many other residents have commented over the past years about the terrible state of both the Red Lion and Star & Garter, and how they have been allowed to slip into a state of total disrepair.

We have suggested that the Star & Garter be properly

boarded off by the owner and a mural depicting local historical buildings / scenes be painted on the hoarding to discourage graffiti. Experts in this type of painting are available within the SBC Curve centre.

The Red Lion site has been redeveloped inside but not in accordance with the planning application, and the outside is not acceptable in our High Street. We are in ongoing

communication with SBC regarding these matters, and that includes the recent demolition and poor 'bodging' repair carried out by the freeholder.

It is clear from enquiries that we have carried out that owners of listed buildings such as these must give special regard to the desirability of preserving the building and its setting and any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possess, to ensure that the preservation does not harm the interest in the building or the local historic significance as well as its function and condition.

We have highlighted the situation to SBC Building/ Planning Control with regards to the obligations each party must meet to preserve and maintain such listed properties as both are situated in highly visible locations, and the Star & Garter also lies within the Conservation Area of the village. As both properties remain a complete eyesore blighting our historic village the CCA will continue to liaise with all agencies who may be in a position to assist in ensuring the current state of disrepair is addressed. Discussions with SBC are continuing as we write.

Colnbrook village history page & meetings

Since 2016, the CCA had been posting 'Colnbrook History' posts on its Facebook page which expanded into a dedicated Colnbrook Village History page during 2017. In the spring of 2018, we were joined in this venture by Dawn Tedder and Kevin Gorman, and also now work closely, and share all information, with the Colnbrook Historical Society.



The page now has some 104 albums of photographs with narrative in many cases. If you feel you can add information or memories to any particular photograph, please feel free to do so as this will add to this history of our communities.

We hold regular meetings of the group, which are promoted on the CCA and Colnbrook Village History Group pages – please feel free to come along and bring your memories with you. We copy / scan any written material, so that you retain the originals.

Heathrow expansion proposals

Residents will be well aware of this 'bonkers' scheme and heartened by Zac Goldsmith MP, (Environment Secretary), recent comment that "Heathrow expansion is 'unlikely' to go ahead and would not survive a proper review". This follows a review by Willie Walsh (IAG / BA Chair) that he won't pay for it and that the chances are 60/40 against the project being built.



The CCA responded to the Heathrow Consultation with a detailed thirteen-page document explaining why the proposal should not go ahead.

As we write this article the High Court is hearing an appeal against an earlier decision bought by several local authorities including neighbours Hillingdon and RBWM (not Slough of course!) together with the London Assembly and groups concerned with the air and noise pollution aspects of the proposal. A decision is expected in early December.

We are encouraged in our opposition that the government has declared a climate emergency and are determined to reduce all forms air and noise pollution.

M25 / J14 clean up

The CCA has been very proactive in seeking changes to the Highways England maintenance and litter picking regime at this junction close to Poyle.

It has been a very long process involving correspondence with Spelthorne Council and Highways England, but eventually we reached the 'right spot' despite prevarication in all directions and had a very meaningful meeting with the manager responsible for this section of the M25 which led to a planned programme of works. We are please to note that most of the promised work has been carried out as we write.

Flytipping & anti social behaviour

These two matters are our staple diet; without them we would have a clean and tidy community devoid of irresponsible individuals who think that rules don't apply to them or are simply not aware of the implications of their actions.

Needless to say, we continue to cooperate and engage with Slough BC, Thames Valley Police, Colnbrook with Poyle Parish Council, our Borough Councillors and other agencies to resolve these and other issues.

The 'problem areas' have been by J14 (see separate section); the land opposite Saints yard within LBH, the shops on Coleridge Crescent; private car parks in small developments; Drift Way verge towards the fields; Rayners Close garages area; Horton Road; Sutton Road and the bypass.



ASB also includes the illegal use of catapults in the village and the throwing of stones and eggs at homes, cars and cyclists. We are aware of recent incidents where information has been reported to TVP and SBC together with CCTV images of the culprits. This is not acceptable, and we will continue to work with our members, residents and partners to stamp this out.

Park and ride scheme – Brands Hill

Unfortunately, we were unable to respond to the SBC consultation on this ill-conceived project due to time issues, however we would have objected to it. This is said to be a park and ride for visitors / shoppers to Slough Town Centre; its on the wrong side of the road for that, too far away, and taken up prime green belt land.

Our conclusion having talked to residents and councillors is that this is actually a park and ride scheme for Slough residents and others living to the west of the airport that work at Heathrow. This would allow Heathrow to claim that they are reducing staff travel into the airport as they are required to do; but in fact, are pushing the problem into local communities and therefore not accountable for that traffic. Time will tell!

SLOUGH & DISTRICT AGAINST RUNWAY 3

Slough & District Against Runway 3 is a Colnbrook based member of a number of groups opposed to Heathrow expansion (see graphic) on the grounds of the additional air and noise pollution that will be imposed on residents around the perimeter should this project ever be given the go ahead.



Air and noise pollution are well documented to be very detrimental to the general health of resident, and particularly children. Colnbrook has a very high incidence of asthma in young children.

This is obviously very important to residents of Slough and the surrounding communities including Colnbrook, Brands Hill and Poyle.

It is with this in mind that we have been active in sharing news and facts about the proposed expansion in order to highlight the folly of this proposed extension and the addition of a third runway.

The history of this project goes back to 1947 when the first application for a 3rd east / west runway was made. That was rejected, as has every other application since.

Without going over old ground, the current position is; -

- Willie Walsh has reversed his view and now says it's 60 / 40 AGAINST expansion; and in any case his airlines (the IAG clan) will not pay increased landing fees to allow it to go ahead.
- Zac Goldsmith MP (Environment Secretary,) has stated this week that "the bonkers Heathrow expansion was unlikely to go ahead, and would not survive a proper review"
- The government is in court as we write, to answer an appeal by Hillingdon and RBWM, other local authorities, the London Assembly and others, against a very quick decision to the case in May when the decision was announced the day before the Climate Emergency was declared by parliament and introduced the Paris Agreement into UK law.
- A number of London local authorities have joined the campaign to stop expansion at Heathrow, Gatwick and City airports in addition to resident led campaigns against expansions at other UK airports.
- Passenger and cargo levels at many UK airports are decreasing by untold degrees due to changes in travel modes chosen by business, holiday and family travellers; down by 5% in some European nations; and spreading rapidly.

Overall, we are in a situation where air and noise pollution are affecting us all; sleep deprivation due mainly to aviation activities is affecting our health, family life and productivity at our workplace.

a beach. It was lovely watching their faces light up, their feet touching the silky sand for the first time and toes dipping into the sea. It was well

worth watching their smiles and hearing their laughter across the beach. Everyone had an enjoyable time.

Towards the end of the summer holidays, a large group of Heathrow Volunteers spent a day at Pippins School and miraculously transformed our Early Years area into an area where trees and shrubs were tamed and contained, areas painted and our gardening area looking more respectable. We were very thankful for their support and the day made a difference for us as a school.



Classroom and Playground Charters are up and running across the school, promoting a common understanding and use of language among our children focusing on the rights respecting schools ethos. The School Council lead the school, developing our work and taking on our

The Partnership has been quite active throughout the last year. We secured funding for landscaping Crown Meadow. A volunteer work group has been established to help keep the meadow as we would expect a wild nature reserve to be. Slough Borough Council along with Groundwork South have worked closely with the CCP on this project. A new notice board has been installed, at the entrance from Horton Road and along with the existing notice board further into the Meadow are information portals for the further works to be carried. The Environment Agency along with the CCP has also made a contribution to help with Maintenance cost up and until March 2020. After which the CCP has committed further funds to help with the maintenance for a further year. Much of this work hopefully will be appreciated by both our residents and those who work within Colnbrook.

We have also provided two local community groups with a funding stream, Pippins Park Herb Garden, and the newly formed Colnbrook History Group have been awarded funding for their projects throughout this year and a contribution towards the new archive store to be situated at the Village Hall.

The Colnbrook Community Partnership is made up from a group of locally based organisations, namely:-

- Slough Borough Council
- Colnbrook with Poyle Parish Council
- Grondon Waste Management Groundwork South Heathrow Airport.

In this form we have, since been working since 2006, and been instrumental for sourcing funding to provide improvements to green spaces in Colnbrook for both our residents and for local wildlife. We have provided funds to install sport and recreational equipment for both our own Recreation Ground and Pippins Park Crown Meadow both are assets of SBC but enjoyed by local residents. We have also had new LED Floodlights put in at Pippins Park to illuminate the tennis court and the MUGA

Our Chair Katy Wallis has worked extremely hard in reading the Heathrow Consultation Document and putting together the reply from the Colnbrook Community Partnership on the document to Heathrow and getting it returned on time to Heathrow.

Most of our Trustees have been long term in service during the life of the Partnership, and we welcomed Katy Wallis last year as our Chair and Katy has brought a new perspective and dynamism to the group and we thank her for that.

The best thing about being a councillor is that it presents opportunities where you find yourself in a position to give a little push to make something positive happen. I have used my dual-role as both a Borough and Parish Councillor to negotiate SBC renting out a permanent office for the Parish Council at Westfield Hall, and to gain permission for establishing a memorial peace garden on a Highways' grass verge at Dickens Place, by the Punchbowl in Poyle, where the Parish Council located one of its two Armistice Centenary "Tommies" last year.

The office will make the Parish Council more accessible to residents, and will over time – I am sure – lead to a number of enhancements of that Brands Hill facility. At the "peace garden", the Heathrow Rangers installed one of the two special Remembrance Benches we purchased last year, stored courtesy of former Councillor Mick Kinane at his Speedway Farm; Mr Vijay Prashar, owner of the Heathrow Yard, kindly donated flagstones for the seating area and a pathway to it. The Rangers put in flower beds and a picket fence donated by HAL.

Heathrow Airport Ltd (HAL) and Keep Britain Tidy recently finished off their installation of gateway features at either end of the Village with flower boxes that are an attractive compliment to them – "big brothers" to the flower boxes they have put out across our Village – I have been pleased to work with them on these beautification projects.

Another of my priorities is road safety – I have supported the Westfield Residents Association in requesting the removal of three parking bays on Trent Road which obstruct visibility and form an unnecessary obstacle around which traffic entering and leaving the Westfield Estate must manoeuvre. Likewise, both I and Borough Cllr Avtar Cheema are using some of our SBC "councillor budgets" to fund a zebra crossing on the Old Bath Road by Rodney Way particularly to help those on the south side to safely get to and from Pippins School and Pippins Park; I would like to thank UCH Logistics for very kindly contributing £3000 towards this project, which I hope will be underway shortly.

Councillor Kashan W Bennett

My name is Kashan W Bennett, I'm the first Pakistani Christian who is elected as a Councillor in Berkshire and overall the 4th in the UK. It's my first year and already I'm involved in lots of projects. I'm also elected Chair of the services committee.

Below is a paraphrase from the text from the nomination made by about Mike when out of nine worthy candidates he won the Colnbrook Community Cup.

Colnbrook with Poyle are lucky to have someone like Mike Nye looking out for residents. In giving up so much time for the community, he is always a consummate professional, passionate and service driven. He Inspires change, helps develop residents' ideas and their solutions. He is ambitious, dynamic and resourceful; this innovative approach produces winning results.

Mike Nye has been a resident for almost four decades and has been involved in a lot of projects in Colnbrook with Poyle and is an ex councillor.

The Colne Valley's "hidden but vulnerable treasures" is what inspired Mike to get involved with the pressures on the park as he saw it summed up by Colnbrook's own "traffic mayhem" – "with queues of huge lorries causing chaos trying to get into a small petrol station", the BP opposite his home in Willow Close.

Mike campaigned against the proposals for a Slough International Freight Exchange, SIFE, which would have had a great impact on our community and the Green Belt. He also addressed the HS2 Select Committee at Westminster, making the case for mitigation of the impact of the Heathrow Express depot at Langley.

While Mike was a councillor he won the argument for Colnbrook with Poyle to stay unchanged, forcing the Boundaries Commission into a rethink on their recommendations to merge the village into a combined Colnbrook & East Langley ward.

His funeral will take place at St Thomas' Church, Colnbrook at 11.00 am Monday 25th November.

All his friends in the community send their condolences to his wife Maggie.
